



BREAD TAGS FOR WHEELCHAIRS



To the Bunnings Activities Organiser:

Bread Tags for Wheelchairs collect bread tags and recycle these in Robe, SA to fund wheelchairs for disadvantaged people, mainly in South Africa. Would you like to be part of this program to save plastic from going to landfill, while at the same time helping the needy? If so, please collect bread tags for us at your Bunnings community BBQs.

What to do

- Get a container such as a 1kg honey tub.
- Make a moneybox type slot in the top, cut out the labels below and stick them on. Put a few bread tags inside to give people the idea.
- Make this part of your BBQ equipment that the community organisations use for their Bunnings BBQs. Ask the volunteers to put their tags in the container. After a while regular customers may start bringing their tags from home too.
- When you are ready (there are no minimum or maximum amounts), send us your tags. You can:
 - post them to us at Aussie Bread Tags for Wheelchairs, P.O. Box 1164, Kensington Gardens, SA 5068, or
 - drop them off at one of our collection points if there is one near you.
